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## 17th Century Style Needlework or Stumpwork Picture

A 17th Century Style needle-work or stump-work picture worked in coloured wools and metal thread, with an enthroned King, possibly Ahasuerus, holding golden orb and sceptre with attendants standing by, in the foreground is a Renaissance fountain with a rock-pool in raised work. Surrounded by various motifs including lion, leopard, horses, squirrels flowers and insects, and a castle in the background. Presented in a walnut cushion moulded frame.

Operating in the early part of the 20th Century, The Cambridge Tapestry Company became well known for producing the finest needlework and tapestries of the day. Much of the companies work was in the style of the 16th-18th centuries. During the 1930s Queen Mary visited the workshops and several pieces are now in The Royal Collection.
