The prominence of the finely carved feather cresting, being the device of the Prince of Wales, might suggest that this fine looking glass was supplied to George, Prince of Wales, later George IV for one of his many houses. The neo-classical design would suggest it was perhaps designed for Carlton House, designed by Henry Holland and built for the Prince between 1783-1796.
